





# INTRODUCTION

Agenda 2030.




#### **Carbon Footprint of Global Tourism**





#### RESEARCH OBJECTIVE



To analyze how the Nexus approach (water-energy-food) can support more integrated and effective sustainable tourism policies in the EU.

#### WHY THE NEXUS APPROACH?

- Traditional sectoral policies often produce trade-offs.
- Nexus offers a systemic view of resource interconnections.
- Enables synergistic solutions in high-pressure contexts.

### KEY ENVIRONMENTAL PRESSURES

- Water scarcity during peak tourist seasons.
- Energy overconsumption and seasonal demand spikes.
- Food supply dependency and food waste.
- Waste generation and wastewater discharge.
- Air and water pollution, especially in coastal and urban destinations.
- Ecosystem degradation and overburdened infrastructure.





#### EU POLICY FRAMEWORK

- European Green Deal
- EU Strategy for Sustainable Tourism 2030
- Water Framework Directive
- Climate Adaptation Strategy
- Integration gaps between sectors remain.

#### METHODOLOGY

- Document analysis of EU policies.
- Literature review on Nexus and sustainable tourism.
- Case studies of high-pressure regions in the EU (e.g., Mediterranean, Alpine, coastal zones).

# FINDINGS

- Limited Nexus integration in current EU tourism strategies.
- Promising local pilot initiatives (e.g., circular tourism, water reuse).
- Governance fragmentation limits systemic responses: tourism is a complex and multi-stakeholder activity

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- Foster cross-sectoral planning at local and EU levels.
- Promote Nexus-based indicators in tourism monitoring.
- Strengthen policy coherence among water, energy, food, and tourism sectors.
- Encourage pilot projects and knowledge sharing.

#### CONCLUSION AND NEXT STEPS

- Nexus is a valuable lens for addressing tourism-related pressures: Incorporate Nexus principles into EU tourism and environmental law through cross-cutting instruments.
- Amend or reinterpret existing directives to explicitly consider tourism-related impacts and interdependencies.
- Develop binding guidelines or soft law instruments (e.g., communications, recommendations) to support member states in aligning tourism policies with Nexus thinking.
- Support pilot regulatory sandboxes in high-pressure tourist areas to test Nexus-aligned planning and legal innovations.
