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## Welcome message

The involvement of youth and early-career researchers is not only a pillar of resilience and innovation, but it is increasingly the core actor of transformative action. We live in a World full of uncertainty, complexity, and many urgent transitions that young people have begun their actions as central agents of change. Youth brings agility, creativity, and interdisciplinary rationale — all essential qualities to address complex systems thinking and analysis.

This belief inspired the establishment of Nexus EXCELLENTIA, a dedicated mentoring programme for young researchers and innovators under the <a href="NexusNet COST Action">NexusNet COST Action</a>. The Action, chaired by Prof. <a href="Chrysi Laspidou">Chrysi Laspidou</a>, University of Thessaly, and co-chaired by Dr. Floor Brouwer, TU Dresden, aims to empower collaborations between EU and international researchers and stakeholders, synthesize the existing empirical Nexus research and produce an intellectual toolkit, demonstrating a clear link to improved resource management and governance outcomes that underline the value of Nexus.

Nexus EXCELLENTIA was launched in 2023, by a small group of enthusiast academics to address a pressing need to engage and support young researchers and innovators.

By today, the Program has brought together more than 40 early-career researchers and innovators (mentees) and experienced individuals (mentors) representing academia, research, industry and business from across Europe and beyond. Pairing young talents with seasoned experts, the Program enabled members to deepen knowledge in their domain, expand their professional networks, and develop critical career skills — laying the foundation for resilient, interdisciplinary leadership in sustainable societal development. Many participants shared how the experience reshaped their professional path — helping them see themselves not just as researchers, but as system innovators ready to address complex nexus challenges.

We are now inviting young researchers and innovators, along with senior executives and leaders from academia, large and medium enterprises, consultancy firms, international organizations to join us at the Nexus EXCELLENTIA Summit 2025. The online event is scheduled for the 7<sup>th</sup> of July 2025 at 10:00-15:00 CET.

Closing this message, allow me to reflect on that "Resilience is not a destination — it is something we construct day by day, through trust, inclusion, and courageous collaboration". If NexusNet has taught us one thing, it is that building networks across generations, disciplines, and geographies is not optional — it is essential.
